Dear Ridgefield Elementary Schools Families,

Our hearts are with the Robb Elementary School community during this tragic time. Yesterday's event continues to shake us to the core and yet we remain focused on the children we serve and our community. As you have likely read in Dr. Da Silva's message, security procedures and protocols have been reviewed and we will continue to act with vigilance. Our schools work closely with our Ridgefield Police School Resource Officers (SROs) and we are grateful for their partnership. We also want to let you know what is in place to support students and to provide you with resources should you need them.

As much as we would like to think that our students will be insulated from atrocities, in our media rich world, students will inevitably hear about the event that took place yesterday. We encourage you to do your best to reduce these moments with our young children. Students' expressions of fear can manifest itself in many forms. It may look like students directly mentioning their fears or it may appear as a student who is unusually moody, active, or disengaged. These are signs our staff look for and we encourage you to also consider at home. If a student does need support, our school psychologists and staff are here to support them. Overall, we keep our message simple, as young children need reassurance. Simple statements such as, "All of the adults at our school are here to keep you safe." If it comes up in a whole class discussion, you can expect that we will acknowledge when necessary and move the class on. We will follow up with individual students expressing concerns. In the event that we have an individual conversation with your child because they are showing signs of concern, a staff member will reach out and let you know that a conversation occurred.
